1. GUESS THE PHRASE



Objective: To encourage students to identify and understand different ways of expressing the same idea while also revising target vocabulary and phrases.



Procedure: Choose a list of target phrases or vocabulary you want students to revise. Copy the prompt below, adding your words or phrases. Give each pair or group a set of paraphrased phrases without revealing the target phrase. Discuss the phrases.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

I'm designing a revision task for my students, in which I have a secret target word or phrase. I provide them with different ways of expressing the same idea, and their task is to guess the target phrase based on the rewritten phrases.

Here is a sample task:

Target phrase: I'm going through a bit of a rough patch.

Paraphrase:

1. I am encountering some difficulties right now.
2. I am having a hard time at the moment.
3. I am facing some challenges currently.

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Task by ChatGPT:

2. KEY WORD TRANSFORMATIONS



Objective: To develop students' grammatical and lexical competence by transforming sentences using a given keyword without changing the meaning of the original sentence.



Procedure: Copy the prompt below to create a transformed version of each keyword. After students have completed the task, review the transformed sentences as a class. Address any misconceptions, errors, or difficulties encountered during the task.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

'm going to provide you with a key word, and you need to create a sentence with the key word, gapping the key word out. The second sentence should have a similar meaning but should not contain the key word. Here is an example:

Key structure: I wish I had

I ___ before he moved away.

I feel remorse for not apologizing to John before he moved away.

Answer: I wish I had apologized to John before he moved away.

Key structure: have a back up plan

The prompt works great with both collocations and grammaticalized chunks.

It also works with simpler structures, which you would typically teach to A1-A2 students.

3. TABOO CARDS



Objective: To let students come up with creative ways to communicate the key phrases to their team without using the taboo or high-frequency words.



Procedure: Prepare taboo cards using the prompt below. Divide players into teams of two or more. A player draws a card with a key phrase on it and tries to get their teammates to guess the phrase without using any of the taboo words listed on the card. They have one minute to get their teammates to guess as many phrases as possible. If the teammates guess the phrase correctly, they get a point. If they do not guess the phrase or the clue giver uses a taboo word, they do not get a point. Once the time is up or all the phrases have been guessed, the next team takes their turn with a new clue giver.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

I'm designing cards for a game of taboo. Make the taboo cards using the key words and list 5 high-frequency words which may not be spoken. The key phrases are: ...

1. Spread yourself too thin

4. UNPOPULAR OPINIONS



Objective: To encourage students to think critically, engage in healthy debate, and express their level of agreement or disagreement with unpopular opinions.



Procedure: Prepare unpopular opinions using your target words. Instruct students to take turns sharing their level of agreement or disagreement with the opinions. Encourage them to explain their reasoning and use examples. Remind students to practice active listening and engage in respectful discussion, asking questions, and considering different perspectives. Encourage students to share any insights they gained or changes in their thinking that occurred during the activity.

Tasks by ChatGPT:

1. The advice to "spread yourself too thin" is overrated. It's better to focus on a few things and excel in them rather than trying to do everything and ending up mediocre at all of them.
2. Having a back-up plan is actually a waste of time and energy. It distracts you from putting your full effort into your primary plan and can make you settle for a mediocre outcome instead of pushing for greatness.
3. "Little did I know" is an excuse people use to avoid taking responsibility for their actions. We should always be informed and prepared for the consequences of our choices, and not blame our ignorance for the outcome.

1. "Spread yourself too thin" is bad advice. Focus on fewer things and do them well.
2. Having a back-up plan is a waste of time. Put all your effort into your primary plan.
3. "Little did I know" is an excuse. Take responsibility for your actions and be informed.

I like the shorter opinions better, they lend themselves to a more productive discussion.

These are extended sentences, which you can discuss with your students or use as model answers.

5. VOCABULARY QUIZ



Objective: To assess students' understanding of the target phrases, improve their comprehension of context, and expand their vocabulary through multiple-choice questions.



Procedure: Allow students to complete the quiz individually, encouraging them to think about the context and usage of each phrase. You may use some other websites to make quizzes more interactive: Nearpod, Kahoot, Wordwall.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

Generate a multiple-choice quiz for the target phrases, their definitions, and distractors for the following: ...

6. GAPPED SENTENCES



Objective: To reinforce students' understanding of target vocabulary words and phrases by completing sentences with missing words, using context clues to deduce the correct answer.



Procedure: Create gapped sentences using the prompt below. Distribute the sentences. Allow students to complete the sentences individually, encouraging them to use context clues to deduce the missing word. Alternatively, students can work in pairs or small groups to discuss their answers and reasoning.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

Create sentences with missing vocabulary words, make sure the sentences provide enough context to deduce the missing word:...

7. VOCABULARY STORY



Objective: To improve students' vocabulary and comprehension skills. To consolidate the use of the target words in a meaningful context.



Procedure: Have students read the story, highlighting the target words, and then discuss their meanings and usage in the context of the story. You may also use the stories for reconstruction (making a summary or retelling it using the target words).

Prompt for ChatGPT:

Generate a story using the words ...

copy + paste

You can get very specific with your prompt. You can narrow it down to a certain topic, you can grade the story by limiting the number of words and identifying the level of your students

So students would have to identify the words and rewrite the text. You can also ask the students to expand on the story, adding more details and paraphrase some of it.

8. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS



Objective: To help students develop their communication skills and give freer practice of the key word in a meaningful context.



Procedure: Select the target words and phrases. Generate the questions using the prompt below. Ask your students to discuss the questions.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

Generate discussion questions with the following phrases ...

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Tasks by ChatGPT:

1. How can we develop strategies to form secure bonds with friends, family, and romantic partners, and how can these bonds impact our lives positively?
2. In what ways can surface-level support be detrimental to our relationships, and how can we recognize and avoid it?

Alternatively, you can gap the target words out, inviting students to identify the word first, filling in the gaps and then discussing it.

Prompt 2 for ChatGPT:

Generate discussion questions with the following phrases ...

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Task 2 by ChatGPT:

After the discussions, bring the class back together for a brief debriefing session. Invite students to share any key takeaways, personal experiences, or lessons learned from their discussions.

9. GENERATING ROLEPLAY SCENARIOS



Objective: To improve students' communication skills in realistic contexts., creativity, and confidence in speaking, as well as to provide students with opportunities for freer practice of the target words.



Procedure: Invite students to select 3-5 phrases they want to use during the role-play activity. Encourage them to choose phrases that they want to memorize better, such as phrases that they personally find useful. Briefly describe the scenario they will be acting out and the roles they will be playing. Assign roles to each student or let them choose their own. Give them time to plan what they will say and allow them to practice the conversation a few times through role-playing.

Prompt for ChatGPT:

Brainstorm possible conversation scenarios

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Tasks by ChatGPT:

1. Coffee shop encounter: Two strangers waiting in line at a coffee shop strike up a conversation about their favorite beverages, local events, or recent news stories.
2. Bookstore browsing: Two people in a bookstore discover they're interested in the same book or genre, leading to a conversation about their favorite authors, novels, and literary inspirations.
3. Art gallery visit: Two art enthusiasts meet at an art gallery opening and start discussing the exhibited artworks, artists, and their personal preferences in art styles and mediums.

Alternatively, you can make the task more specific by adding particular language items you want your students to use during a certain conversation. For example, this is the task I created for my students:

A park bench where strangers strike up a conversation and get to know each other.

overpowering, take pride in your achievements, unleash creativity, stir up memories

A restaurant where a couple is having a romantic dinner.

- ✓ *take my mind off*
- ✓ *the uncharted territories*
- ✓ *slip under our radar*
- ✓ *made it next to impossible*

I wrote some of the words down, asking them to try and use it in a particular context. Once they used all of the phrases, they could move onto the next dialogue. I also prompted them with a dialogue generated by ChatGPT.

Person B: Yes, I've noticed that too. The fragrance is quite strong, but it's also beautiful. It seems to stir up memories of springtimes past.

10. CREATING QUIZLET SETS



Objective: To help save busy teachers some time when designing quizlet sets.



Procedure: Create the definitions using the prompt below. I include the word itself, the definition and a couple of examples with the target word gapped. Copy the prompt adding the words you need. Go to Quizlet, create a new set. Click "Import".

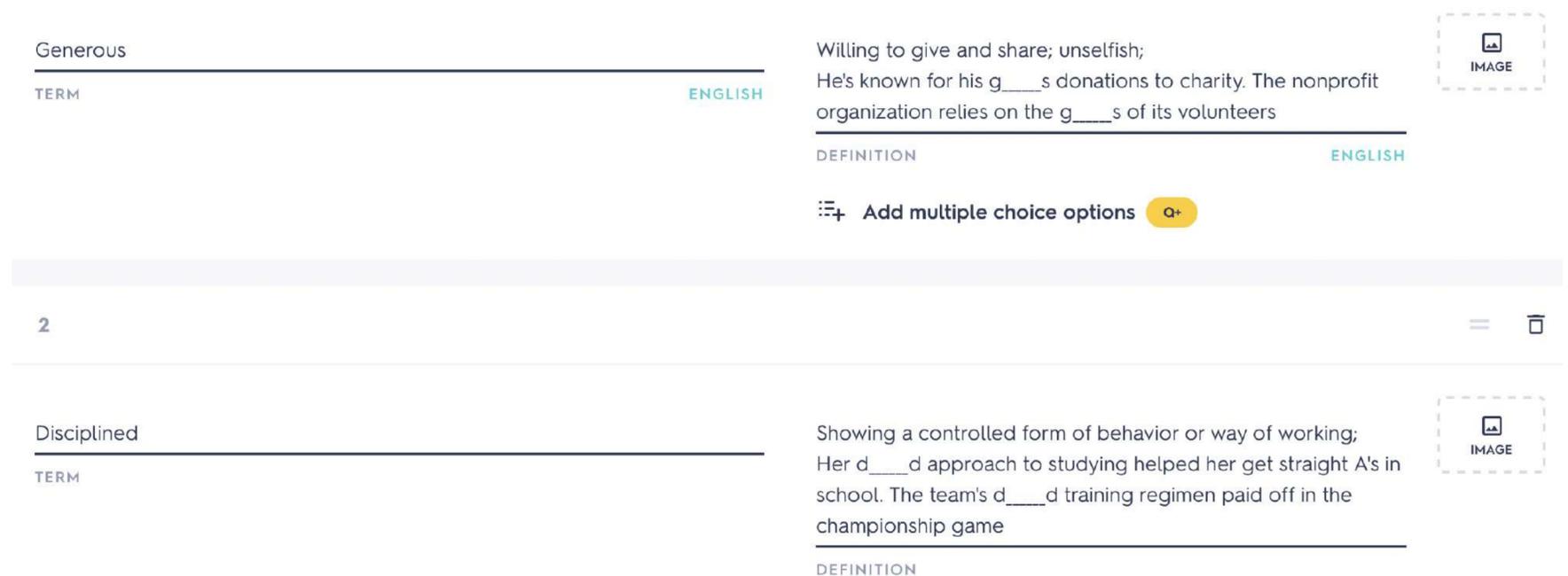
